



# Maple Leaf Parish

“If my people, who are called by my name, will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their sinful ways, then I will hear from heaven and forgive their sin and will heal their land.” 2 Chronicles 7: 14

As I was thinking about what to write this month, part of the above verse popped into my mind, and I consider it a God moment that the Holy Spirit directed me to the complete verse and its location in scripture (after searching a concordance without success), and also an indication that this is what I’m supposed to write about. In last month’s newsletter, Pastor Mark wrote about renewal, revival and being open to a fresh movement of the Holy Spirit in our lives and in our churches. We’ve also been reading about the revival at Asbury University in Kentucky, which he mentioned, and had the opportunity to see the new film “Jesus Revolution” in a local theater. If you haven’t seen the film, I recommend it for teens and adults, keeping in mind it has a PG-13 rating.

The events in the movie happened when Mark and I were children, but the ripple effects of the Jesus revolution of the early 1970’s influenced our faith and vocational paths. We’re hopeful that the revival at Asbury U. is the beginning of a much-needed Jesus revolution for a new generation that is dying to know God and for a fresh out-pouring of the Holy Spirit.

A book that was also influential for me as a youth was The Cross and the Switchblade by David Wilkerson. Would you believe I found this book in my public high school library—another God moment! Wilkerson was a pastor who ended up working with teenage gang members in New York City. He founded Teen Challenge, which is connected to the Minnesota Adult and Teen Challenge in Rochester, a successful faith-based drug and alcohol treatment center. Why would a book about God changing the lives of violent and drug-addicted gang members in New York be relatable for a mostly -wholesome Minnesota farm girl? Because I had the same hunger to know God and find meaning and purpose for my life as they did!

One of the things I remember in Wilkerson’s story, is that he was directed to work with the gangs as a result of time spent in prayer. As a busy pastor, he was neglecting his prayer life. (Can I get an Amen?!) Where to find more time for prayer? He decided he was wasting a lot of time watching evening TV, so he got rid of his television (wow!) and spent that time in prayer, with miraculous results.

I don’t expect to get rid of my TV, though with the quality of programs, I agree that watching it is largely a waste of time and many of the shows do more harm than good. Same for the internet. But even if we don’t take Wilkerson’s action, I invite you to join me in devoting more of our screen time to prayer. A great revivalist was asked the secret of spiritual revival. “There is no secret,” he replied. “Revival always comes in answer to prayer.”

The Bible says that whenever the early church prayed, the Spirit was miraculously poured out. The early Methodist revival came in answer to prayer. Early Methodists prayed faithfully from four to five a.m. and from five to six p.m. daily. No wonder the leaders started fires of revival wherever they went!

Please help me with something. When you see me, please ask, “Pastor, what time have you carved out, daily, to spend in prayer?” Please help hold me accountable on this. And consider asking yourself the same question. I would also be open to anyone who wants to meet regularly to pray together. What would happen if more individuals prayed more often, or if a group or groups met to pray? Let’s see where God leads as we pray and seek God’s face. *God Bless, Pastor Deanna*

Please let me know if you'd be willing and able to tell and share your faith story some time in the near future.

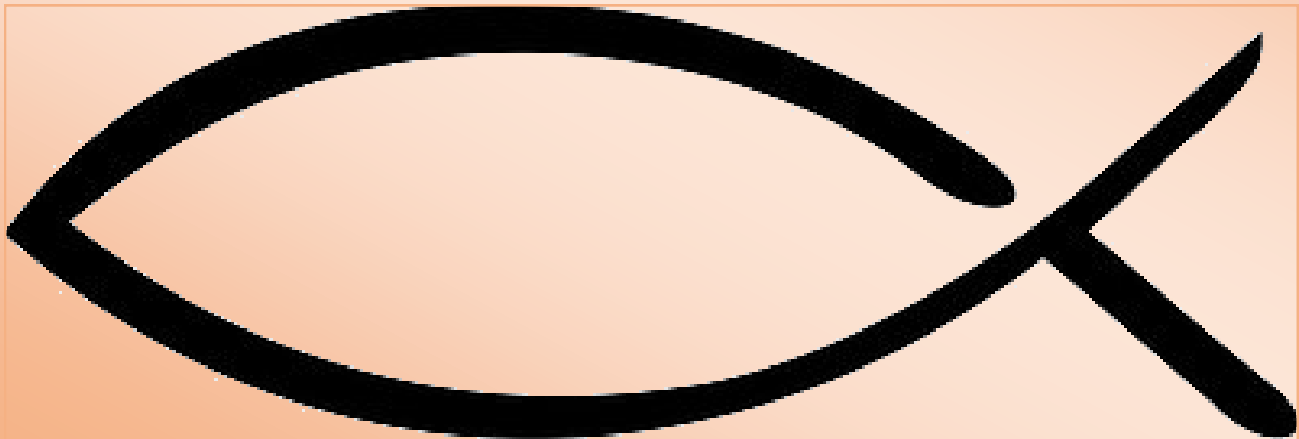

**PRESTON CHURCH EMERGING PROJECTS.... Prayer is essential...**

The Preston Church Board of Trustees and Church Council are researching some major projects in caring for our church building and property.

- Renewing the Landscaping in front of the church.... estimates are being sought on this project which would involve new rock, edging, some bushes and in general rehabilitating the landscaping in front of the church building
- On the South end of the church building the construction of a small retaining wall to prevent erosion on the steep bank near the kitchen door.
- Overlaying the church parking lot with new asphalt as the current pavement is severely cracked and is breaking up in places. (a previous estimate on this project came in at over \$50,000.00.)

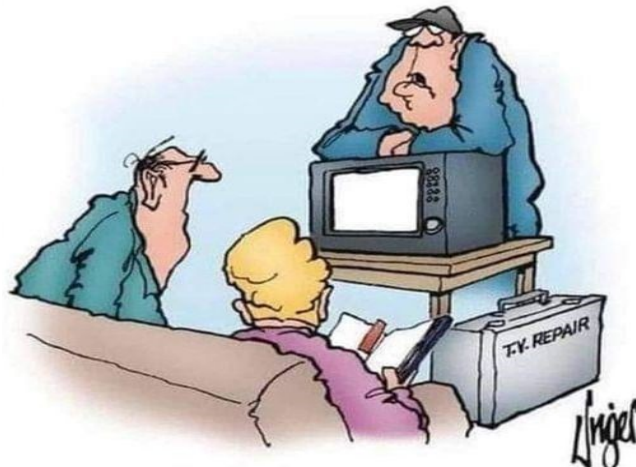

We want to be good stewards of our church building and property, but we need to find ways to finance major projects without detracting from the important ministry of our church....So.....please pray about these potential property-related projects as we do our homework and find ways to come up with a plan.

## Cherry Grove Church Kitchen to be Dedicated

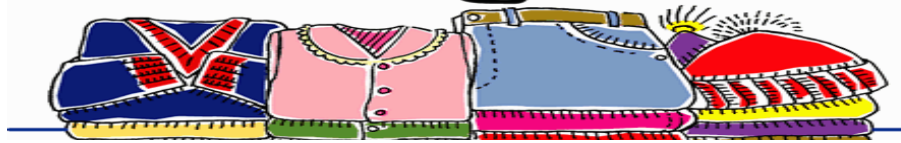
## Clothing Drive and Giveaway

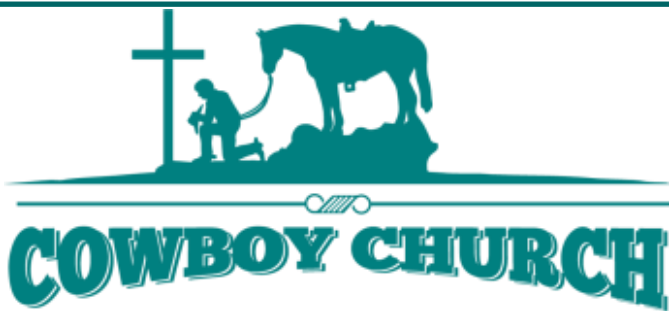

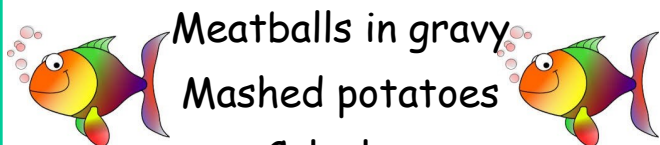

## Preston Church Council Meeting Minutes March 14, 2023

Present: Pastor Mark Woodward, Pastor Deanna Woodward, Jenny Dornink, Greg Dornink, John Goutcher, Dan Miller, Sue Hovey, Jerry Brink, Nancy Dahly.

Greg called the meeting to order on March 14, 2023 at 6:05pm. Pastor Mark led opening devotion and prayer.

Jenny moved to approve the agenda. Seconded by Jerry. Motion passed.

Jenny moved to approve the Secretary's Report. February minutes were taken by Pastor Deanna. Seconded by Sue. Motion passed.

In the Treasurer's Report prepared by Kristi Anderson, expenses for February were more than income. Expenses have been consistent, although the gas bill has been going up over the winter and there has been more snow removal expense. The MAC radio grant that we received a few years ago was zeroed out and the remaining funds were sent to FC Schools to be used for the milk and lunch program.

From the Finance Committee, Dan reported the average weekly offering for February was under budgeted expenses. Apportionment received to-date was \$185. Average attendance for February was 23. The renewing of CDs was discussed to get better rates upon renewing.

From the Trustees Committee, Jerry reported light bulbs have been replaced in the apex of the sanctuary. Other ballasts will be repaired as needed. The new fridge has been delivered and installed in the kitchen.

From the Worship Committee, Pastor Mark was looking for ideas to bring more people to worship services. The Lenten services have been going well. Dan Miller inquired about having an Easter brunch on Easter Sunday. There will be a signup sheet in the narthex for rolls, juice, etc.

From the Missions Committee, Sue reported food and monetary donations are being collected for the Foodshelf for March FoodShare Month. Pastor Deanna recommended donating \$300 to the Preston Foodshelf from the Good Samaritan Fund.

From Staff/Parish Relations Committee, Pastor Mark handed out the current list of church leadership. Suggested donations for use of church were briefly discussed. The MN Conference is having all churches update their profiles. Pastor Mark handed out copies of the previous profile that was submitted in 2018 and the new form to be filled out. He asked Council members to fill out the form and the answers will be compiled. The profiles are used for matching churches with new clergy members and for the new Conference leadership to learn about the churches in the Conference.

From Evangelism and Outreach Committee, Pastor Mark is looking into putting out information through mailings, newsprint, etc to the area to promote our church and reach out to the community. He encouraged 'intentional promoting' of the church and what is going on in the church.

From the Education Committee, Pastor Mark reported LIFT will be starting again on April 5.

From the UMW, Nancy reported they are planning a UMW presentation during an upcoming worship service.

In Business, Jenny reporting plans are progressing for the Codfish Dinner on April 14. She has been checking prices and ordering food items. The cake sign-up is in the narthex. Letters are going out to congregants regarding information about the Dinner and the Prepping Schedule for the week of Codfish. She contacted the Boys Scouts and they are interested in helping again.

During the Pastor's Report, Pastor Deanna reported Palm Sunday and Communion Sunday will be April 2. On Thursday, March 16, 2023, Pastors Mark and Deanna are planning to attend a statewide meeting in Bloomington with the new Bishop for Pastors of traditional/evangelical congregations.

Jenny moved to adjourn the meeting. Seconded by Sue. Meeting adjourned at 7:53pm.

Pastor Deanna did the closing prayer.

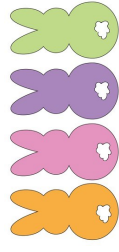
