Power Pole not a thing of beauty, but certainly something for which to be thankful....

There was an intense blast of winter weather in Fillmore County on April 16, 2023 just one week past Easter, we went from temperatures in the 70's - 80's to a wild mix of snow and wind and freezing weather. Deanna and I drove on Highway 16 in the midst of blowing snow and treacherous road conditions, we crept along the road driving quite slowly. When we finally reached our home out in the country, we noticed the yard light was off and the house was very dark -- something was wrong. Sure enough the electricity was off. After going into the house and lighting a few candles, I found my flashlight and did some investigating. Out in the front yard the electric power pole was lying in the snow. It was snapped off at the base due to heavy tree limbs which fell on the wires. After assessing the situation and thinking about it for a bit, I called the Preston Public Utilities emergency number to report the broken power pole. Within a half an hour the crew was gathering in the front yard. They came together in the midst of inclement weather on a Sunday evening with expressions of kindness, friendship and courtesy. One of them hollered out to me, "Hey Pastor Mark we'll get this fixed, we're happy to be of help!" I explained they could wait until morning to do the repairs as I felt bad about them being out in miserable weather on a Sunday night.. They continued with determination, efficiency and professionalism and by 3:00 a.m. the electricity was back on again and a new pole was put up.

There are so many things in life for which to be grateful. In the midst of crummy weather, people gave of themselves to help us in our situation. I have been thinking about this quite a bit since that evening. As Christians it is part of our ministry to be the kind of people who help others, encourage one another, and show compassion and kindness. It's also our job and our mission to be grateful and appreciative of all the blessings we share together. The mission and ministry of the church of Jesus Christ, in my opinion, is to be a Body of Believers who live and share the Life of Jesus in the world today. Sometimes it is easy for people to complain or lament and I believe we are all guilty of this from time to time. Sometimes it is easy to be negative, pessimistic, judgmental, critical, and bitter, but those are not the ways of Jesus.

As I looked out the front window that dark night with the snow blowing around in the yard, I saw a group of talented, professional and dedicated guys working together to bring light and energy once again to our house. There is much to be said here that could relate to the message of our Christian faith. Because people worked together for the common good, once again Light was shining in the darkness! There are numerous parallels here to the Good News of Jesus!

Deanna and I are very grateful for the dedicated and efficient work of the Preston Public Utilities crew. They even came back later the next day to see how things were. The new pole is standing and soon another talented person, Mr. Wayne Frank, our electrician, will come back to finish the job.

In all of life, be grateful, be kind, be uplifting, be gracious, be gentle, be dependable, be involved, and be able to share your talent and ability to the glory of God! And in many ways, the Light of Jesus will shine in the darkness all to the glory of God. That night was dark only for a short time and soon as people gave of themselves out of compassion and kindness the Light was shining in the darkness and the darkness will never overcome it!

Thank you profoundly for those who gave of themselves to help us that stormy night! Now may we be grateful people giving of ourselves as disciples of Jesus to live and share God's unending love.

Yes!!!! The Light does shine in the darkness and the darkness will never overcome it! Praise be to God!

I am grateful to share in mission and ministry with you all to the glory of God!

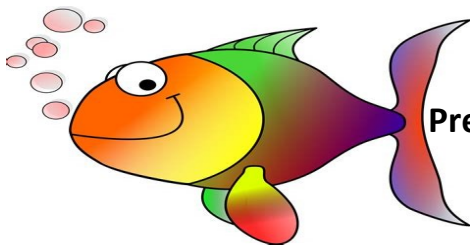

Planning for Spring – Summer Youth/Sunday School activities and events...

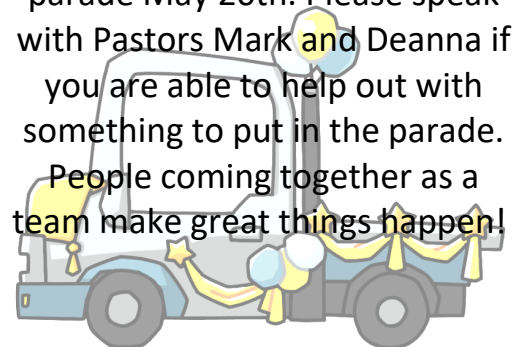

DURING THESE DAYS.....LOVE FINDS A WAY...

As most of you are aware, the churches of the Maple Leaf Parish: Spring Valley: Faith, Cherry Grove, Fountain and Preston have been in a time of discerning and praying about their future and how to move forward in mission and ministry in light of complicated and polarizing topics relating to various social issues and theology. It is clear that our churches represent diversity of opinion and belief. However, it is also clear that our people want to see our churches be strong, vital and actively involved in mission and ministry. Many people have expressed that they want to move forward to the glory of God and live and share the Good News of Jesus.

With all of this in mind, it becomes clear that we need to be respectful and compassionate in ministry. Let's face it, we will not all agree on everything, but as John Wesley once said, we need to be united in the essentials of our faith, but not be overly concerned with topics on the periphery. In the sanctuary of the Spring Valley: Faith Church there is a banner which hangs on the South wall: LOVE FINDS A WAY surrounded by both a crown of holly and a crown of thorns....representing the birth, life and suffering of Jesus.....John Wesley ardently believed that LOVE is at the very core of Christian faith and life.

So..... during these days, how best do we allow Love to find its way forward, to be people of faith who follow Jesus? How best do we do mission and ministry together in building UP the Body of Christ in the world today?

The following information was shared at a recent Confirmation class session. It bears reprinting here in this newsletter because it describes who we are as Christian people. (This information was printed by the United Methodist Publishing House, Cokesbury.) This describes who we are....the time is here to move forward to the glory of God in Jesus Christ. Yes....love does find a way.....

Our United Methodist Beliefs

United Methodists share a common heritage with Christians of every age and nation

* **God created humanity to live in covenant with God.**

As sinful creatures, we have broken that covenant and stand in need of redemption. Because God truly loves us, God acted through the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ to bring us salvation and the hope of eternal life.

* **God's love comes alive in us by the work of the Holy Spirit.**

The Spirit works in both our personal experience and in the common life of the church.

* **We are part of Christ's universal church.**

We enter the church through baptism. In Holy Communion, we celebrate the presence of Christ and find strength for Christian living.

* **We believe that the reign of God is both a present and future reality.**

This prospect gives us hope in our present actions.

* **We believe that Scripture contains everything necessary for salvation.**

We believe in justification by grace through faith in Christ and in the general ministry of all Christians.

* **We believe that the church is one in Jesus Christ.**

We express our unity in hymns and liturgy, in the historic creeds, and in the belief in one holy, catholic, and apostolic church.

**United Methodists also have distinctive emphases, a legacy of our founder,
John Wesley:**

*** Preventive Grace**

God's love surrounds us even before we are aware of it. It leads us to want to please God, to discover God's will, and to an awareness of our sin.

*** Justification and Assurance**

God reaches out to the repentant believer with accepting and pardoning love. Through faith in Jesus Christ, we are justified-forgiven and restored to God's favor. This experience of conversion can be sudden and dramatic or gradual. Wesleyan theology emphasizes that we can know we are saved.

*** Sanctification and Perfection**

God's sanctifying grace helps us grow more loving toward God and neighbor, drawing us toward God's gift of Christian perfection, being perfect in love.

*** Faith and Good Works**

Faith in God's redeeming work in Jesus Christ is the only response to God's love we need. However, we express our salvation in good works, sharing God's love with others.

*** Mission and Service**

Salvation always involves Christian mission and service to the world. Personal religion, evangelical witness, and social action go hand in hand and build on each other.

*** Nurture and Mission of the Church**

The church nurtures our personal faith and equips us for mission and service in the world.

Preston Church Council Minutes—April 19, 2022

Church Council Meeting Minutes – April 11, 2023

Present: Pastor Mark Woodward, Pastor Deanna Woodward, Jenny Dornink, Marlene Peterson, Dan Miller, Sue Hovey, Jerry Brink, Dollie Acton, Nancy Dahly.

Pastor Deanna called the meeting to order on April 11, 2023 at 6:05 pm. Opening devotion and prayer was led by Pastor Mark.

Jenny moved to approve the agenda. Seconded by Jerry. Motion passed.

Pastor Mark moved to approve the Secretary's Report. Seconded by Jerry. Motion passed.

In the Treasurer's Report prepared by Kristi Anderson, the expenses in March were about \$466 more than income. March general expenses were consistent with previous months. February snow removal was \$250. The gas bill has been going down with the arrival of warmer weather. \$290 was received and sent in for UMCOR. The apportionment of \$595 that was received during the first quarter was sent in. Dollie moved to approve the Treasurer's Report as presented. Seconded by Sue. Motion passed.

From the Finance Committee, Dan reported the average weekly offering for March was \$848.69, which was less than the weekly needed amount of \$1000.17. Apportionment received in March was \$220. At the end of March, 29% of the budget has been spent. Average attendance during March was 22.

From the Trustees Committee, Jerry reported there were bids returned for landscaping around the church from The Treehouse and The Rustic Rose. The bid from The Treehouse was more detailed with a lower price than The Rustic Rose. The Treehouse also provided a picture of the proposed finished project. There was discussion about the 2 bids and funding for the project. Jerry also received a bid for cleaning the mildew on the church exterior for \$1550. The trustees will review the bids, prioritize proposed projects, and discuss financing with Memorial/Finance. This will be followed up on in a future meeting with hopes a decision can be made soon to get the project done this year. Preston Clean-Up Day will be April 22 and there was discussion about cleaning around the church on the same day. More details to come.

From the Worship Committee, Pastor Mark reflected on the Lenten series on the 250th Anniversary of the hymn Amazing Grace.

From the Missions Committee, Sue reported the donations of food and money were taken to the Preston Foodshelf. The \$300 donation for March FoodShare Month from the Good Samaritan fund was also delivered. She also submitted the rebate for the new fridge and our account will be credited.

From Staff/Parish Relations Committee, Marlene reported the church profile was updated and sent to the Conference to have on file.

No report from Evangelism and Outreach Committee.

From the Education Committee, Pastor Deanna reported the 3rd session of LIFT started April 5 and there were about 12 kids participating.

No report from the UMW.

In Business, Jenny reported Codfish Dinner is rapidly approaching and everything is falling into place. Meatball prep will take place on Wednesday, fish packing on Thursday, with the culmination of the Dinner on Friday.

During the Pastor's Report, Pastor Mark reported that he and Pastor Deanna attended a meeting with the new Bishop Lanette Plambeck and District Superintendent Michelle Hargrave, along with 30-40 other pastors that are also wrestling with the current topics going on within the Conference. A compromise proposal would be put forth to remain part of the UMC Conference but function as a traditional Methodist Church, as we are now. Bishop Plambeck and DS Hargrave affirmed this proposal.

Jenny moved to adjourn the meeting. Seconded by Jerry. Meeting adjourned at 7:17 pm.

Denis Cornell moved that a poll be taken of the congregation to better understand where the congregation stands on this issue, Gene Halverson seconded. Motion was defeated two in favor, five opposed.

New Business- Contract for the Toshiba printer expires in July, Megan/Jane received quotes from 3 companies, E. O. Johnson was lowest bid and we are currently contracted with them. Gail made a motion to keep contract with E.O. Johnson, Barb seconded. Motion was made by Gene Halverson to authorize Jane Baker to make deposits and pick up the money bag from First National Bank, Mary Grems seconded. Motion approved. Decision was also made for Jane Baker to cover Jan Hammon absences.

Old Business-AED has been ordered per recommendation from Sue Puffer. Brenda and Matt Stier have volunteered to purchase the machine. Sue will provide any training needed to interested individuals.

Jan Hammon resigned as Council and Finance chair.

Gail made a motion to adjourn Gene seconded, motion carried. Meeting ended at 8:15.

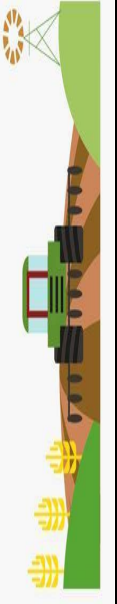
