REV. MAXWELL P. GADDIS....METHODIST EPISCOPAL CHURCH 1855

While attending the recent Annual Conference held in Saint Cloud, Minnesota, I had an opportunity to look at many of the display tables in the hallway. One table had a collection of antique books that were being given away. Many of the volumes were from the 1800's -- books that were duplicates in the Conference library. One of the books dated 1855 was written by Rev. Maxwell P. Gaddis and it was an autobiography of his ministry in Cincinnati, Ohio. He was a pastor in the Methodist Episcopal Church of that era. This book caught my interest and it is now a cherished part of my personal library.

In reading portions of this old book, I was intrigued with many of the similarities between the mid 1800s and our world of 2023. Rev. Gaddis lifts up struggles, challenges and obstacles faced by the church of his day as well as divisions and tensions in American society in 1850 leading up to the Civil War. There are similarities and differences between the era of 1850 and our era of 2023. In 1850 the Methodist Episcopal Church couldn't build church buildings fast enough to keep up with the growing influence of early Methodism on American society. (I wish we had that problem today!) However, even in the glowing days of rapid growth there was growing division, conflict and polarization over the issue of slavery. There were many factors in society and culture that led to opposing views on a variety of topics in the life of the church and soon in 1845 there was a split in the Methodist Episcopal Church. At this point there were now two churches: Methodist Episcopal Church North and Methodist Episcopal Church South. This division would last until 1939 when at last the two churches would reunite as the Methodist Church. Rev. Gaddis goes into much detail about the pain, hurt and conflict of this era.

Often the process of Reformation is not easy or painless. In the 1500's Martin Luther broke from the Catholic Church over a variety of theological issues and in the 1700's John Wesley broke from the Church of England over theological issues as well. In our world today, the process and experience of Reformation continues. Rev. Gaddis even wrote about it in his book from his experiences in 1855. In the midst of all this, President Abraham Lincoln writes that during his day the Methodist Church was one "of the most American of churches."

Today, the United Methodist Church is experiencing a diversity of opinion and belief expressed in a variety of ways. Rev. John Wesley believed that it is important to be united in the essentials (doctrinal beliefs), but there is room for diversity in the things he described as "non-essential" (social issues).

Rev. Gaddis in his day believed in building up the Body of Christ and he urged people to be committed to building up the local church and giving of themselves in commitment, prayer, finances, talent, ability, giving of themselves to really promote the mission and ministry of Jesus Christ. Maxwell Gaddis was keenly aware of the challenges and difficulties of his day, but he wanted the church to flourish in every way possible to bring people into a personal relationship with Jesus. Despite the challenges of today's world, our Maple Leaf Parish Churches are committed to being vital in ministry in the United Methodist Church and to function in ministry as we always have done as traditional, evangelical churches building up the body of Christ in the world. (This is the position which our churches have recently embraced.)

Yes, Reformation is ongoing, we live in a different world than Rev. Gaddis did. Still, there are similarities which cause us to realize that we are very much a part of the church of Jesus Christ in the world. The world is continually changing, but Jesus Christ remains the same yesterday, today, tomorrow and forever.

The time is here to promote unity, compassion, and the awesome power of love as disciples of Jesus. We are a part of the Body of Christ in the world committed to building up the mission and ministry of the church of Jesus Christ! Yes, each day will bring new challenges. But, each new day will also bring new opportunities to serve in building up the church to live and share the Good News of Jesus!

Recently, I talked about the power of God's love and I referenced my ordination banner. I also wrote about it in the Fillmore County Journal. I am convinced that it is the love of God in Jesus Christ that will lead us forward in the power of the Holy Spirit. Let's not focus on the things that divide, but rather on the things that bring people together and bring people to Jesus. I sincerely believe that it is love that finds a way! We must be committed to building up the mission and ministry we share together.

Rev. Maxwell Gaddis was a pastor during a turbulent time in our country's history. In reading his book, I am convinced that despite challenges and difficulties it is God in Jesus Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit that leads us forward.

I look forward to seeing you in church on Sunday. We have important work to do. We are a part of the modern day mission field of 2023 committed to bringing people into a personal and growing relationship with Jesus for the transformation of the world!

Ready? Let's roll up our sleeves, put on our boots and open our hearts to Jesus. We are in ministry together to live and share the Good News of Jesus!




The words of the Apostles' Creed goes a long way in informing who we are as Christian people within the United Methodist Church.









Lenora Church in the 1890's



Annual Conference Report
Pastors Mark and Deanna Woodward and
Preston Church member John Goutcher attended

this year's United Methodist Minnesota annual conference meeting in St. Cloud on May 31-June

1. The theme of this year's gathering was "Encounter. Transform. Respond. The Emmaus Experience." Based on the Emmaus Road story in Luke 24: 13-35, Bishop Lanette Plambeck reminded those present that this story of the two disciples on the road is our story, too, and that the impossible becomes possible through

encounters with the resurrected Christ who brings healing, reconciliation and hope. During this challenging time in the United Methodist Church, she invited us to lean in to one another and declare that there is enough love for all of us.

She reminded each person: You are loved. You

are a child of God and a person of worth.

Rev. Dr. Michael Beck of Florida was also a featured conference speaker. Beck co-pastors two Florida churches and a network of "fresh expressions" led by laity that gather in various public spaces. "Dinner church" is an easy starting point for a fresh expression, Beck said. Others that he's involved with center around people's shared interests and hobbies and take place in a tattoo parlor, online, at a restaurant, a hair salon, a dog park, and even at an electric car charging station.

Milestones in ministry were observed, including the honoring of 14 clergy who entered retirement. Four pastors were newly ordained as elders, two were commissioned as provisional members, 13 were authorized to serve as licensed local pastors and three local pastors were recognized for completing their five-year course of study.

Resolutions were approved opposing assault-style weapons, addressing the Israeli detention of children, and supporting both a U.S. Regional Conference and the re-wording of language related to human sexuality in the Book of Discipline. Conference members also approved disaffiliation agreements made with 14 local churches that have chosen to leave the UMC. After the vote, the Bishop asked that we pray that even as we part ways, may these congregations continue to live out their faith and serve as beacons of light and hope.


