"Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up." Galatians 6: 9

According to Greek mythology, a character named Sisyphus cleverly cheated death twice. As punishment, Zeus condemned him to push a large, heavy boulder up a hill. When Sisyphus and his rock reached the top, the rock always rolled back to the bottom, and Sisyphus had to begin his task all over again. This assignment was to be repeated over and over again, for all eternity. So a repetitive, frustrating, seemingly endless job is sometimes referred to as a "Sisyphean task."

There are plenty of jobs we do in life that are repetitive. Mowing the lawn—unless we have a drought—is usually a weekly summer exercise. Shoveling snow has to be done every time there is a winter snow storm. Weeding the garden is necessary because the weeds are relentless. Parents of tots are changing diapers and straightening up messes throughout the day, until the little cherubs go to bed. There are meals to be cooked, dishes to be washed, laundry to be cleaned, floors to be mopped, gasoline to be pumped, cows to be milked, crops to be planted, tended and harvested. These are just a few examples of work that needs doing over and over to keep life running smoothly, and this is not to mention factory and other types of employment that involve repetitive activities.

But if we think about it, even within the repetitive "grind" there are many blessings. My maternal grandmother had a plaque on her kitchen wall that said, "Thank God for dirty dishes; they have a tale to tell. While others may go hungry, we're eating very well. With home, health and happiness, I shouldn't want to fuss. By the "stack" of evidence, God's been very good to us." Now I have this saying on our refrigerator at home and it reminds me of Grandma Dora, and also of the blessing of having food to serve the family when others are not as fortunate.

Having dirty laundry means that we have clothing to protect us from the elements. Changing diapers and cleaning up messes means that we are blessed with children and family. Caring for a home, a yard, a car, a farm, means that we are blessed with all of these when so many others are not. Repetitive tasks on the job mean that at least we are employed! And in our day and age we can be grateful for the many labor saving devices that our ancestors didn't have.

In our churches, we are so grateful for the people, both paid and volunteer, who help with the tasks that keep our wheels turning. In many areas, we are in need of more volunteers to help take care of the blessings God has given us. Some jobs are repetitive, involve commitment and don't always receive the recognition they should. But all are important as we look after the people, both children and adults, the property and the soul saving work that God has entrusted to us. And as we each participate, there will be a time when we can look back at what we have accomplished, and then (unlike Sisyphus) go on to the summit and take our rest beside the Rock of Ages, who will say, "Well done, good and faithful servant."


Open Your Heart Summer Challenge:
