One Thanksgiving Evie was called on to say the prayer for dinner. I remember in the prayer he thanked God for the food, for the turkey and for the blessings we shared together, but in the prayer he also said, "help us Jesus to share your love in every way we can..."

...And so, this Thanksgiving in a world with so many problems, let us find ways to be truly thankful and let us find those special ways to live and share the love of Jesus in every way we can... I am thankful for the ministry we share together! I am thankful for the churches of the Maple Leaf Parish.... I am thankful for you.

That old Iowa farmhouse is a blessed place in my memory, but there are other houses today filled with laughter, gentle, happy voices, the aromas coming from within. The cold wind still blows across Minnesota fields, but through it all the blessings of God's love in Jesus leads us forward into a new day. In all things rejoice in

the goodness of God and be thankful for the blessings we

share...



Church Council Meeting Minutes – October 10, 2023

Present: Pastor Mark Woodward, Pastor Deanna Woodward, Jenny Dornink, John Goutcher, Sue Hovey, Marlene Peterson, Dan Miller, Greg Dornink.

Greg called the meeting to order on October 10, 2023 at 7:03 pm. Opening devotion and prayer was led by Pastor Mark.

Jenny moved to approve the agenda with additions. Seconded by Dan. Motion passed.

Pastor Mark moved to approve the Secretary's Report. Seconded by John. Motion passed.

In the Treasurer's Report prepared by Kristi Anderson, the expenses in September were consistent with previous months. A total of \$300 was sent in for UMCOR for Hawaii Relief. The 3rd quarter of apportionment contributions of \$600 was sent in at the end of September. Total apportionment still owed is \$4747. The Codfish CD was renewed from an interest rate of 0.20% to 4.0%. Sue moved to approve the Treasurer's Report. Seconded by John. Motion passed.

From the Finance Committee, Dan reported the average weekly offering for September was \$870, which was less the weekly needed amount of \$1000.17. Apportionment received in September was \$200. At the end of September, 93% of the budget had been spent. Average attendance during September was 21.

From the Trustees Committee, Pastor Mark reported the paper towel dispensers in the restrooms have been filled, the furnace filters changed, and batteries in fire alarms have been checked/replaced by Jerry Brink. The Trustees have noticed the west upstairs entrance needs some painting. It was requested the Trustees make a list of the projects that need to be completed for the fall for parishioners to work on as they are able.

From the Worship Committee, Pastor Mark proposed having a special Thanksgiving service on the Sunday prior to Thanksgiving during the normal worship time instead of having a service Sunday night. This idea was accepted by the council. There was discussion about having some sort of treat/ice cream after the Brad Boice performance, but there might not be enough people to help serve.

No report from the Missions Committee.

From Staff/Parish Relations Committee, Marlene passed out forms for year-end Conference reports.

No report from Evangelism and Outreach Committee.

From the Education Committee, Pastor Mark reported the October session of LIFT started off tremendously with about 15 kids participating.

No report from the UMW.

There was no additional business to discuss.

During the Pastor's Report, Pastor Mark reported there will not be a Trunk-or-Treat in the parking lot. Pastor Mark may get some candy to hand out at the church or downtown. Pastor Deanna confirmed with Sue that there will be a Mitten Tree again this year so it can go in the next newsletters. Pastors Mark and Deanna will be conducting the Charge Conference, either after church or as part of a regular monthly meeting. Jenny moved to adjourn the meeting. Seconded by Pastor Mark. Meeting adjourned at 8:06 pm.

Wednesday, October 4th, 6:30 p.m.

The Fountain UMC Admin. Council met at the church on October 4, 2023 at 6:30 p.m. with Steve and Sheila Arnold, Loni Wingert, Sheila Walbridge, Mitchell Walbridge, Jerry and Shirley Wingert and Revs. Deanna and Mark Woodward attending. Chairman Steve Arnold called the meeting to order. Rev. Deanna opened with prayer. Minutes from the May Council meeting were read and approved on a motion by Loni, seconded by Jerry.

Treasurer Loni Wingert gave the financial report. The current checkbook balance includes monies received from the United Methodist Women. About \$2000 per month in offerings are needed to support the church budget. No conference apportionments had been paid to date. Sheila A moved that one half of the apportionments be paid this month. Sheila W. seconded the motion. Motion carried. Mitchell asked about investing church savings in accounts that pay higher interest rates. Steve A. will check on interest rates with Thrivent and Loni will check with the Fountain bank. Jerry moved and Sheila A. seconded the motion to accept the treasurer's report. Motion carried.

Trustee chairman Jerry W. reported on the replacing of galvanized pipes. The church will need to pay to replace pipes on our property. Mitchell will check with the city on the deadline for replacement. Grant funds may be available from the state or the Annual Conference.

UMW report: The Fountain United Methodist Women met on Sept. 9 and voted to disband the group. They also voted to give their remaining funds totaling \$925 to the Fountain U. M. Church's general fund. They will not be available to serve at funerals and other events. We are thankful for their many past years of service.

Pastor Parish Relations Committee: Pastoral evaluation forms were given to committee members. The parish PPRC will meet with our district superintendent at a date yet to be scheduled. The committee will be deciding on clergy compensation for 2024 with forms to be submitted to the conference by December 1.

Old business: Rev. Mark commented that the July 23rd outdoor service and potluck picnic at the park went well with good weather, good music and people attending from all four parish churches as well as some Lutheran neighbors.

Pastor's Report: Rev. Mark asked about ideas for outreach to the Fountain community. There was discussion but no conclusions reached. Rev. Deanna reported that a special statewide Annual Conference session will be held online on Nov. 13. Our yearly local church conference will be scheduled for early January. She also mentioned the need for Christian education for young children in our church. There is a new parish group for 5-7th graders and an after school program for students in grades 1-5 based in Preston.

New business: After discussion, the consensus of the Council was to have the yearly Thank Offering Service on November 12 at 8:30 a.m. with music by Steve Arnold and Walter Bradley and possibly some other Arnold family members. There will be coffee, juice and donuts served after worship—no potluck this year. Sheila W. offered to donate treats from the famous Bloedow's Bakery. Loni is donating juice. Food will be served on the main level. No stairs to climb.

The meeting was adjourned.
