Recently, the Spring Valley Overhead Door Company came to our house to repair and adjust our garage doors. Neither door was working properly....they sometimes would not open and at other times they would not close....they were temperamental and kind of unpredictable. The repair person came and sized up the situation. Within a fairly short period of time he had the garage doors working as they should -- they went up and down smoothly as they were supposed to!

Doors are very important. In fact, Jesus mentions doors in his ministry. In Revelation 3:20 we are told "Jesus stands at the door and knocks..." We are called to open the door and to let Jesus come in to be with us....Yes the Bible is full of references to doors and how we are called to open the door to let God into our lives.... The Scripture also references how God symbolically opens the doors to let the Holy Spirit move in and through his people. The Bible is full of examples of doors, doorkeepers, opening doors, and all kinds of images of opening doors to Jesus.

Here we are standing at the threshold of the New Year of 2024. The door leading to new beginnings, new opportunities and new adventures is about to open.

How will God open the door in 2024? How will we respond to all that God is doing in our lives and in the life of our churches? Early in my ministry, Willet Stoskopf was the custodian of the Preston Church building. He would often tell me how important it was to keep the church doors unlocked during severe, arctic cold winter weather. He was of the era when churches were seldom locked. Since then, times have changed and our world is not the same. Nevertheless how do we allow God to move in and through us in the New Year of 2024?

"God Opens the Door in 2024..." God opens the door for new commitment, involvement, opportunity, mission and ministry...God moves in our lives to bring about new energy, enthusiasm, encouragement, and excitement.... We are being called afresh to do the work of mission and ministry as disciples of Jesus .

The beautiful and inspiring Christmas carol, "Joy to the World " calls us to repentance and to turn away from the power of sin and evil.

"NO MORE LET SINS AND SORROWS GROW , NOR THORNS INFEST THE GROUND; HE COMES TO MAKE HIS BLESSINGS FLOW AS FAR AS THE CURSE IS FOUND....HE RULES THE WORLD WITH TRUTH AND GRACE, AND MAKES THE NATIONS PROVE THE GLORIES OF HIS RIGHTEOUSNESS, AND WONDERS OF HIS LOVE..."

Let's begin the New Year of 2024 totally open to God's way of living. Let's allow God to open the door in 2024....to begin the New Year walking hand in hand with our Savior Jesus. It is my prayer that 2024 will be a year filled with new opportunities for mission and ministry as we seek to build up the Body of Christ in our communities and in our world.

God opens the door in 2024..... Jesus stands at the door and knocks.....Jesus is knocking at the door right now....

I opened a door on an old shed that hadn't been opened in a while....at first it squeaked and was hard to open, but with a shot of oil it opened easily....Sometimes we need a shot of oil, too from the Holy Spirit as God opens the doors of our hearts.....God opens the door in 2024..... Praise be to God!

May your 2024 be filled with blessing and joy as we share together the Good News of our Savior Jesus! Happy New Year! Keep the door open to experience God's redeeming and transforming love.....

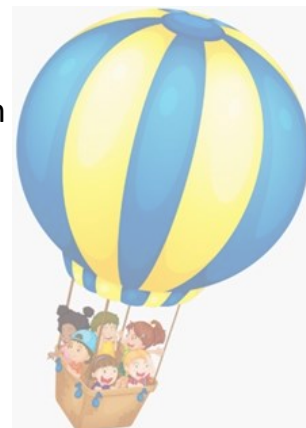

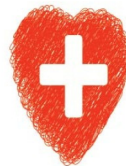

Fall Mini Market And Quilt Show

Thank you all who helped make this year's Mini Market a success, from donating gift baskets, sharing your lovely quilts, buying items and enjoying a cinnamon roll and coffee to having lunch with us. It would not be possible without your continued support.

There were 19 gift baskets plus 2 donated quilts that brought in \$1109.00. Fantastic! 78 meals were enjoyed.

United Women in Faith, who organized the event, took in around \$2500.00. At our last UWF meeting, we dispersed around \$3500.00 to local non-profits, Faith Church and global non-profits. These were listed in the December Newsletter.

Some interesting history of Mini Market.

Starting in 1972, Mini Market was known as The Bazaar. It was held on November 10th from 9:30 am to 4:00 pm! At that time, there were 8 Women's Circles and 18 workers were needed the day of the event.

Lois Carson was the chairwoman and Judy Vreeman was the co-chair. The menu consisted of sloppy Joe's, baked beans, cabbage salad, tossed salad, pie and beverage. And the charge for the meal was \$1.35. Morning doughnuts and coffee were 10 cents each. About 225 people were served.

The name was changed to Fall Mini Market in 1975. Members of the committee that year were Darlene Vrieze, Huberta Fenstermacher, Lena McKenzie, and Hazel House. The youth sold candy and the couples club offered cards for sale. Isla Seabright was in charge of making doughnuts and the Senior High youth made the posters. At that time there were 8 Women's Circles.

Today, we have one UWF unit and no circles.

Circle assignments in 1975 were:

Circles 1&2 - Baked goods and produce

Circle 3 - Crafts & Christmas items

Circle 4 - White elephant items

Circle 5 - Clean up

Circle 6 - Morning & afternoon coffee

Circles 7 & 8 - Lunch

Hours: 9:30 am to 4:00 pm

A total of \$767.63 was taken in.

Over the years, the length of Mini Market has decreased to the present time of 1:30 pm. By 2000 there were only 4 circles: Mary, Ruth, Naomi and Sarah.

Greg called the meeting to order on December 12, 2023 at 6:00 pm.

John moved to approve the agenda. Seconded by Marlene. Motion passed.

John moved to approve the Secretary's Report. Seconded by Dan. Motion passed.

In the Treasurer's Report prepared by Kristi Anderson, the expenses in November were less than income. November expenses were consistent with previous months. A memorial gift of \$1110 was received to be used for General Funds. Another gift of \$250 was received to be used for special occasions in the church. Kristi is preparing a proposed budget for 2024. John moved to pay the remaining apportionment due for 2023 from the General Funds after designated funds are used. Seconded by Marlene. Motion passed. John moved to approve the Treasurer's Report as presented. Seconded by Sue. Motion passed.

From the Finance Committee, Dan reported the average weekly offering for November was \$1165.75, which was more than the weekly needed amount of \$1000.17. Apportionment received in November was \$1310. YTD apportionment received was \$4121.50. Average attendance during November was 24.

From the Trustees Committee, Jerry removed the screens in the sanctuary and vacuumed out the screens and windows.

From the Worship Committee, Pastor Mark reported the performance of Matt and Brenda Stier on December 10 was wonderful. PUMC Christmas Eve Service will be at 7pm.

From the Missions Committee, Sue reported the donations for the Mitten Tree will be collected after Christmas and taken to the Preston Food Shelf/SEMCAAC office.

From Staff/Parish Relations Committee, Marlene reported the funeral policy is being worked on. The meeting with the District Superintendent in November went well, and the new DS wants this church to succeed.

From Evangelism and Outreach Committee, John is still looking to update the member roster with cell phone numbers.

From the Education Committee, Nancy reported the next session of LIFT starts on January 3, 2024.

In Business, John and Shirley Goutcher would like to restart the tradition of goody bags of apples, oranges, candy, etc. to give out after the Christmas Eve Service. They are willing to assemble bags with anyone who is willing to help. Pastor Mark seconded this idea. The Council approved unanimously.

During the Pastor's Report, Pastor Mark reported a gift of \$1000 was received for the Good Samaritan Fund. His motto for the upcoming year is "God opens the door in 2024."

Jenny moved to adjourn the meeting. Seconded by Dan. Meeting adjourned at 7:26 pm.

Church Council: Council Chair Diane Howard called the meeting to order. The minutes of the November meeting were reviewed. Mary moved to approve, second by Denis. Motion approved.

Finance Committee: The estimated 2023 budget was reviewed. Diane commented that it is a lean budget. The committee recommends paying other church staff the same percentage increase as the pastors in 2024. It was suggested that we have a representative from our insurance agency attend a future meeting to discuss the premium increase. Apportionments are still short. We will see what receipts come in by the end of the year. There was a discussion about the use of mission endowment savings. Mark moved and Diane seconded the motion that we add monies from mission endowment savings to what was given in the noisy offerings to total \$500 for the children of Ukraine. Motion carried.

Membership Committee: Total Membership 245. Recorded the death of Mariel Greenlee, restored Angela Grabau, and transfer of Lois Suckow.

Trustees: The furnaces are operating. Tom Ramaker is monitoring the use of ceiling fans in the sanctuary.

United Women in Faith: Eighteen people attended the Christmas luncheon on December 5. The next UWF meeting is in February. There were many compliments on the Mini Market food, the basket fundraiser, and the beautiful quilt display.

Missions: Nancy reported that the special Christmas offering will be given 75% to the Kingsland backpack program and 25% to Church World Service. There were many at the church to pick up gifts on December 12th as part of the Christmas in Fillmore County program.

Education: The Sunday School Christmas program is this Sunday, December 17. Thank you to Pam Shaw, Diane Howard, Cindy Seabright and Suz Eberle for leading the Christmas program and Sunday School. Substitute teachers are willing to help. The teachers are happy with the curriculum materials. It's great to have the supply room organized. It would be fun to have a youth lock-in this winter.

Worship Committee: The Stiers' music was enjoyed on December 10. Christmas Eve services are at 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. Norma and Peggy Merkel are reorganizing coffee hour servers into quarterly groups. Updated member's phone numbers are needed. It was suggested to have a card drop in the offering with updated phone and address information. Lent is on the horizon. Possible weekly noontime soup luncheons and services are being considered.

Pastors' Report: Mark commented that God is good and God will "open the door in 2024." All committees need more involvement and people need ways to connect. Diane Howard added that we have come a long way in a year given the many challenges and she is proud of where we are. Deanna mentioned the need for more to sign up to provide food items for the community Christmas dinner. A blood drive will be held at Faith UMC on January 15. Meals on Wheels is in need of more volunteers.

New Business: We will be printing the newsletter in color at no extra cost as color copies are included in our contract. Pianos are being tuned.

Denis moved to adjourn, seconded by Stuart. Motion approved. Pastor Mark closed with a prayer.

Christmas Eve falls on Sunday this year. After discussion, Loni moved and Sheila W. seconded the motion that we have a 6 p.m. candlelight service but no morning service on Dec. 24. Motion carried.

Pastor's Report: Items donated for the food shelf will be delivered this week. Rev. Mark reported on the recent Maple Leaf Parish Pastor-Parish Relations Committees' meeting with the district superintendent. He also mentioned some plans for outreach in the Fountain community. Rev. Deanna reminded the Council that our church conference will be held in early January, on a date yet to be set.

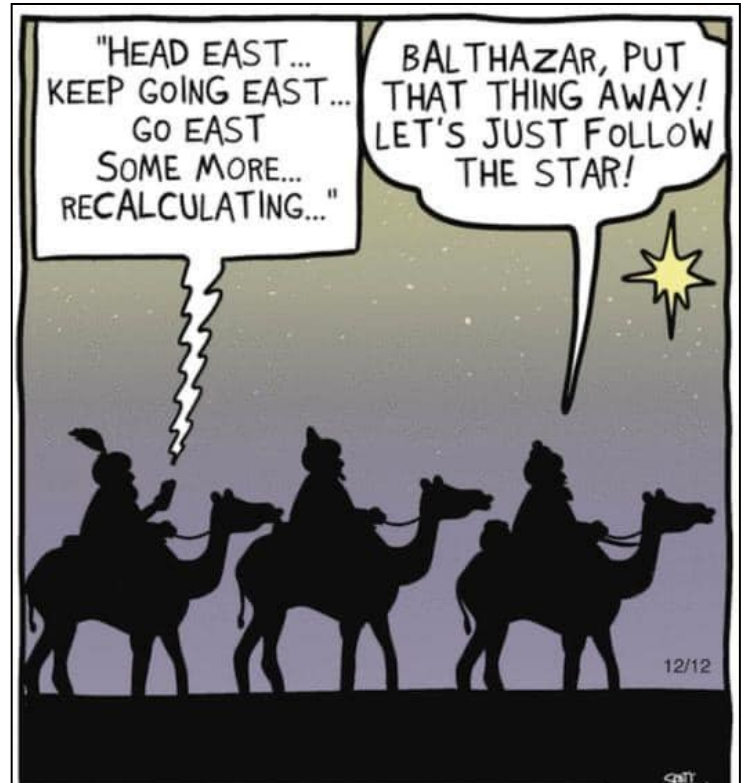
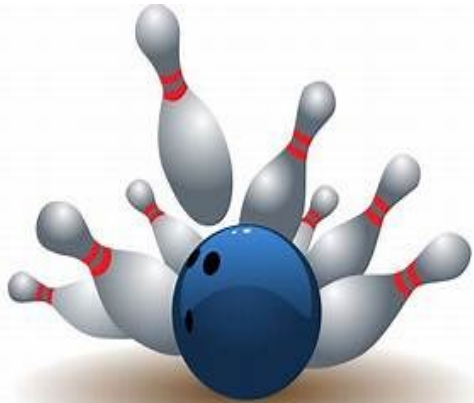

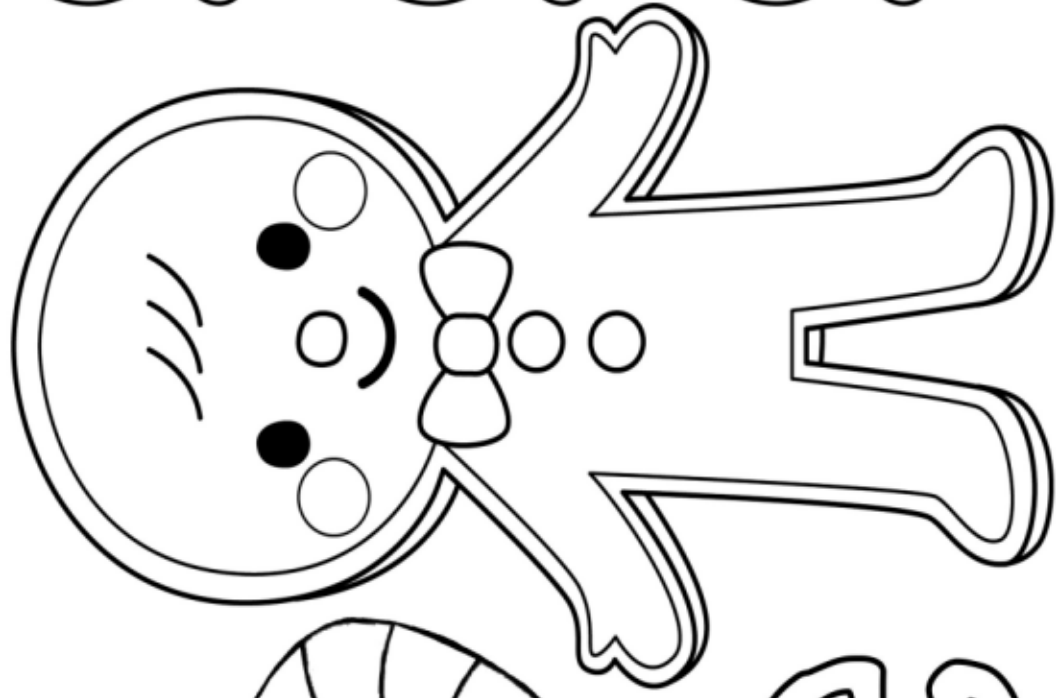
Community Christmas Dinners

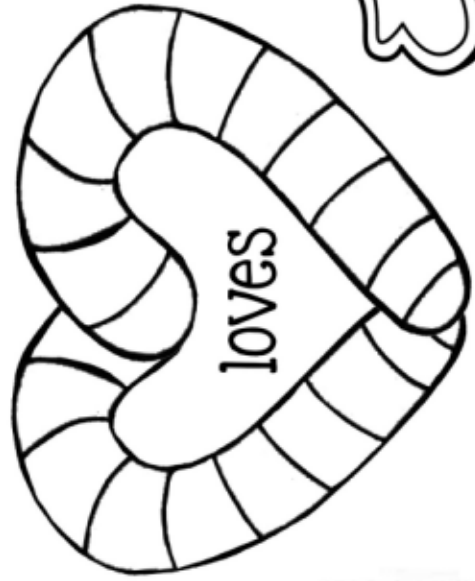

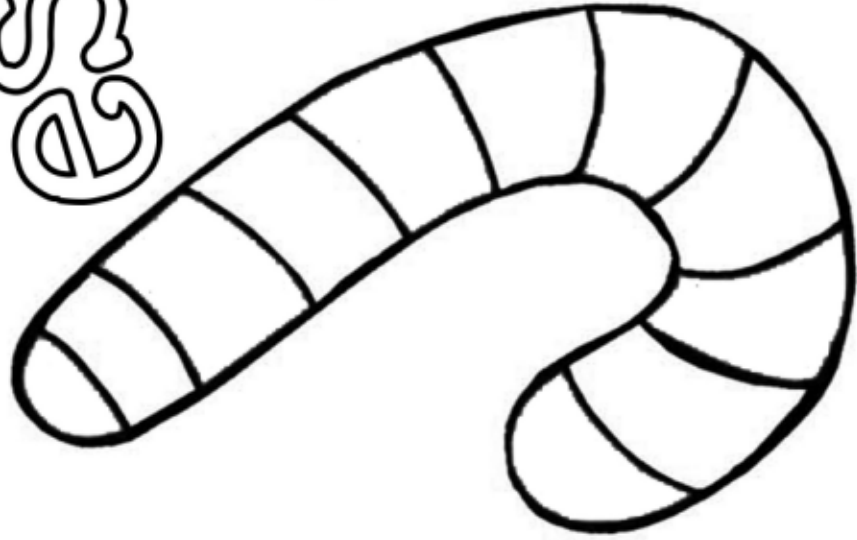
