He is the kind of friend who is always there, the kind of friend who is continually faithful, dedicated and loyal. Jesus' friendship with us is based in true, genuine love. I opened up my hymnal and turned to page 526 and began thinking about the message of this great song. "What a friend we have in Jesus, all our sins and griefs to bear! What a privilege to carry everything to God in prayer! O what peace we often forfeit, O what needless pain we bear, all because we do not carry everything to God in prayer. Have we trials and temptations? Is there trouble anywhere? We should never be discouraged; take it to the Lord in prayer. Can we find a friend so faithful who will all our sorrows share? Jesus knows our every weakness; take it to the Lord in prayer. Are we weak and heavy laden, cumbered with a load of care? Precious Savior, still our refuge; take it to the Lord in prayer. Do thy friends despise, forsake thee? Take it to the Lord in prayer! IN his arms he'll take and shield thee; thou wilt find a solace there." (Joseph M. Scriven, 1855)

Jesus is our best friend in so many ways. During this Lenten season may our friendship with Jesus grow stronger and stronger. As the sun streamed in the window, I felt so much better knowing that Jesus truly is my best friend. As we journey through Lent, we come ever closer to the cross of Jesus and we realize again and again just what an awesome friend Jesus is. He goes all the way to the cross and extends to us a love that will never, never end.







Greg called the meeting to order on February 13, 2024 at 6:00 pm. Devotion and prayer was led by Pastor Mark.

Jenny moved to approve the agenda with additions. Seconded by Jerry. Motion passed.

Sue moved to approve the Secretary's Report. Seconded by Pastor Mark. Motion passed.

In the Treasurer's Report, Kristi reported the expenses in December 2023 were consistent with previous months. December expenditures were about \$1780 over income. The 4th quarter office expense reimbursement was paid to Faith UMC. The final apportionment payment of \$4747.00 was submitted to the MN Conference using 4th quarter donated funds of \$2462.50 and the balance of \$2284.50 from the general fund. This fulfilled our obligation of \$6646.00 for apportionments. Kristi reported expenses in January have remained consistent. The milder winter has kept the utility and snow removal expenses down from previous winters. January income was about \$938 over expenses. Our 2024 apportionment obligation is \$6750.00. Pastor Mark moved to approve the Treasurer's Report as presented. Seconded by Jenny. Motion passed.

From the Finance Committee, Dan reported the average weekly offering for December was \$1284.00, which was above the weekly needed amount of \$1000.17. Apportionment contributions received in December was \$240. Average attendance during December services was about 28.

Average weekly offering for January was \$1022.50, which was just under the weekly needed amount of \$1065.56 for 2024. Apportionment contributions received in January was \$290.

Average attendance during January services was about 22.

From the Trustees Committee, Jerry reported cleaning is ongoing throughout the church.

From the Worship Committee, Pastor Deanna reported Ash Wednesday is on February 14 and there is a schedule of Lenten Services in the newsletter and bulletins. The Ash Wednesday service will be in Fountain at 7pm. The Wednesday soup suppers and Lenten Services will rotate among the churches. PUMC will be hosting the soup supper on February 28.

From the Missions Committee, Sue reported March will be FoodShare Month for collecting donations for the Food Shelf. The donations are matched by the state MN FoodShare program.

From Staff/Parish Relations Committee, Marlene reported the committee met on January 5 to discuss the janitor position. They agreed to keep things as is with Jerry coming in on Tuesdays to take care of what needs to be done.

From Evangelism and Outreach Committee, Pastor Mark reported this is an ongoing endeavor to reach out to the public. Our Superintendent, Reverend Michelle Hargrave, will be preaching in Spring Valley and Preston on May 19. There is discussion about having a potluck following the Preston service. She will preach in Lenora in the afternoon. Fillmore Central Baccalaureate Service will be at PUMC in the evening of May 19.

From the Education Committee, Marlene reported the 2nd session of LIFT started in January and there were about 18 kids participating. This group was very energetic. The next session will start on April 3.

In Business, Jenny reported the Codfish Dinner will be April 5. Watch for more information.

Dollie moved to donate \$100 to the Fillmore Central Post Prom. Seconded by Sue. Motion passed.

Dan brought up the idea of donating to the Fillmore Central Booster Club for the next school year. This can be discussed further before the next school year starts.

Kristi reported we received notice from our insurance agent, Cherrie Brink, that the church's insurance will go up 22% in May. Cherrie is willing to come in March to discuss options of deductibles, etc.

John has been working on updating the cell phone list for church members but has met with struggles to get phone numbers. He will keep working on it.

There was nothing further to add in the Pastor's Report.
