For 44 years MN FoodShare has worked to address food insecurity and poverty by engaging communities throughout the state. With soaring food prices and inflation, we all feel the pinch, but some more than others.

* 537,890 Minnesotans are facing hunger 34% are under the age of 18

* Minnesotans made an estimated record breaking 9 million visits to food shelves in 2024. Up 20% from the previous record in 2023

* Annual visits to food shelves are now 150% higher than they were prior to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Our local food shelves are included in those seeing increases in usage and expenses.

During the month of March we will be collecting food donations, especially high protein items (like canned meats, dried beans and lentils), baby food, wipes and diapers, feminine hygiene products and Depends.



THE SOURCE OF MY STRENGTH

In 1944 Rev. Charles Stanley wrote an inspiring book titled THE SOURCE OF MY STRENGTH. In the book Stanley addresses a variety of themes and topics that relate to our life's journey. We find that our humanity is strengthened by the powerful presence of God's love in Jesus. The book is one of optimism, renewed hope, spiritual vitality and Christian love. It is a book that reminds us that Jesus goes with us each and every day, even when the road gets bumpy and steep he is with us to guide us and uphold us, to renew our strength! During the Lenten season, I would like to draw on some of the uplifting themes Stanley describes as we think about our relationship with Jesus and one another. When we think about Jesus as being the source of our strength we experience a renewed optimism that fills each day with a new sense of joy and peace. I thought the book would be timely as it addresses some of the emotions people experience in the course of a day.

Feelings such as loneliness, fear, rejection and insecurity fade in relation to the awesome power and presence of God's love in Jesus. The author reminds us that we do not succumb to that which is negative, but we are renewed by that which is full of the power of the Holy Spirit as Jesus guides us and upholds us. Jesus is the source of our strength guiding us forward through all of life. There is a sense of optimism that comes by being strengthened in our faith and commitment!

So during Lent let's be open to being renewed and strengthened by Jesus going with us each day. It is Jesus who lifts us up and calls us his very own by the awesome power of his love and speaking of love, it is the love of Jesus Christ. Let's share that love with one another and with the world around us! We rely on the life changing power of Jesus Christ because he is our strength today and everyday! During Lent let's think about and consider for ourselves, Jesus the source of our strength.

We are truly blessed and thankful! This church is warmed by the Holy Spirit and also by seven new furnaces installed by the Rubin Mechanical of Spring Valley. It might be -20 outside, but warm as toast inside!

Estimate for the 7 furnaces was\$28,000Discount for buying all seven-\$1000Additional cost to fix the airflow problem+\$500End Balance\$27,500

MN Energy Rebates \$2,450 The rebate dollars will be placed in Capital Maintenance Fund for future needs.

A PERSONAL NOTE FROM PASTOR MARK

On February 5, 2025 I had my annual physical at the Mayo Clinic, Rochester, MN. After a variety of tests, it was determined my PSA level was too high. Additional tests including an MRI and a biopsy revealed that I have early stages of prostate cancer. I believe this is hereditary as my dad had it as well. While I am not happy with the news, I feel very blessed that this health issue has been diagnosed and addressed in an early and timely way.

I have met with Mayo Clinic urologists and skilled physicians to proceed with a treatment plan. Currently, I have received medical advice stating that surgery most likely would be the best treatment option for me. I am extremely blessed to have the resources of a world class medical institution so close to home.

If I go the route of surgery which has been recommended by Mayo Clinic, I will be recuperating for a few weeks and this will affect some of the activities and events in our ministry. I am currently listed for surgery on April 23rd. I have asked the Reverend Wane Souhrada to provide pastoral guidance during my time of healing. I will do my level best to keep the church family up to date. I am grateful for your prayers, your support and your friendship. While a cancer diagnosis is not happy news, there is happy news in early diagnosis and treatment, for which I am thankful. I will share more later as I know it. I am thankful to be your pastor and I will do my best to guide our churches and to uphold my ordination vows to be a faithful pastor in mission and ministry as a disciple of Jesus.

Please keep my family and I in your prayers in the coming days as the direction for my treatment becomes clearer. I am thankful for the bond of Christian love and friendship we share together all to the glory of God.



His philosophy still inspires Heifer's work today. Partnering with farmers across a range of different livestock and crops, we create unique solutions to local challenges. Together, we build inclusive, resilient economies, so communities can develop effective ways to end global hunger and poverty in a sustainable way.

Heifer International is working to end world hunger in 19 countries across four continents. Heifer works in Bangladesh, Cambodia, Ecuador, Guatemala, Haiti, Ethiopia, Honduras, India, Kenya, Malawi, Mexico, Nepal, Nigeria, Rwanda, Senegal, Tanzania, Uganda, the United States of America and Zambia.




Faith UMC will be having a Church wide Rummage Sale again in May. Start setting aside items as you begin your Spring cleaning. More details in the April Newsletter.
