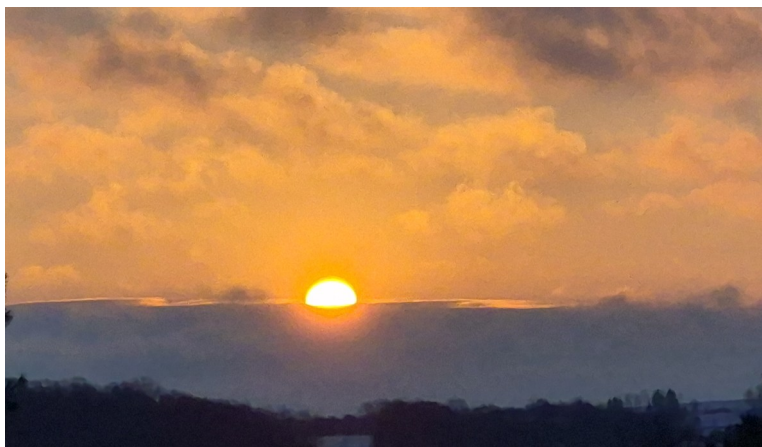

As we come to celebrate Easter, I hope we all can take time and enjoy a holy moment of God moving in our lives regardless of our journey, regardless of our hurts, pains and losses -- regardless of the clouds that sometimes block the sun -- may we take time to rejoice in the goodness of God giving thanks for God's unending love in our Savior Jesus who is not dead, who is very much alive today and always. And because Jesus is alive, we too, can be alive as we open our hearts to walk with Jesus through all of our life's journey.

So...as we come to Easter this year, let's pause and consider that question we've been wrestling with during Lent, "Are We Able?" Are we able to follow Jesus? Are we able to open our hearts to him? Are we able to accept him as Savior and Lord of our lives?

As I stood there on that sun-filled morning, I gave myself again to Jesus! He is my Lord and Savior !!! Am I able to follow him? I'm sure gonna try! Jesus is very much alive!!! "He ain't dead any more!!!" Praise be to God!



I hope you have a joyful, holy and blessed Easter with your family and friends and may we always know and never forget just how much Jesus loves you and me! It is a blessed privilege to be your pastor and to share in ministry with you!

## FAITH CHURCH UPGRADES SANCTUARY LIGHTING...GOES TO LED LIGHT BULBS

In a recent project, the Faith Church Board of Trustees hired the McConnell Electric Company to upgrade the sanctuary lighting to more energy efficient LED light bulbs. It is estimated that this will save a considerable amount of energy and will also provide for a brighter and better illuminated sanctuary area. Previously, the sanctuary was lit by "CFL curly cue" light bulbs and several were beginning to wear out. The church will be receiving an energy rebate through the Spring Valley Utility Company in the near future. All together this project was quite illuminating for everyone involved and did not come as a shock..



## *In Memory of Eric Howard, Stained Glass Window Restored*

Recently, the historic stained glass window on the East end of the Spring Valley Faith Church Fellowship Hall has been beautifully restored using money in memory of Eric Howard. The window is from the Spring Valley Congregational Church building. The Congregational Church previously stood where the current Spring Valley Library stands today. In the late 1960s the Methodist Church, Evangelical United Brethren Church and the Spring Valley Congregational Church united to form our current church family.

Thankfully, the beautiful stained glass window was saved and transplanted to the new church in the early 1970s.

With new electric lighting and wiring the window now radiates with color and is truly glorious. Under the leadership of Mr. Tom Ramaker and the Faith Church Board of Trustees this window now shines brightly once again. In addition to Tom Ramaker, it was inspiring and meaningful to have Eric's sons Lucas, Seth and Cody involved in the project. Lucas, Seth and Cody were joined with excellent guidance from Eric's Dad, Terry Howard with support from Tyler Brown and Scott McConnell. The historic stained glass window featuring Jesus as the Good Shepherd shines brightly once again.

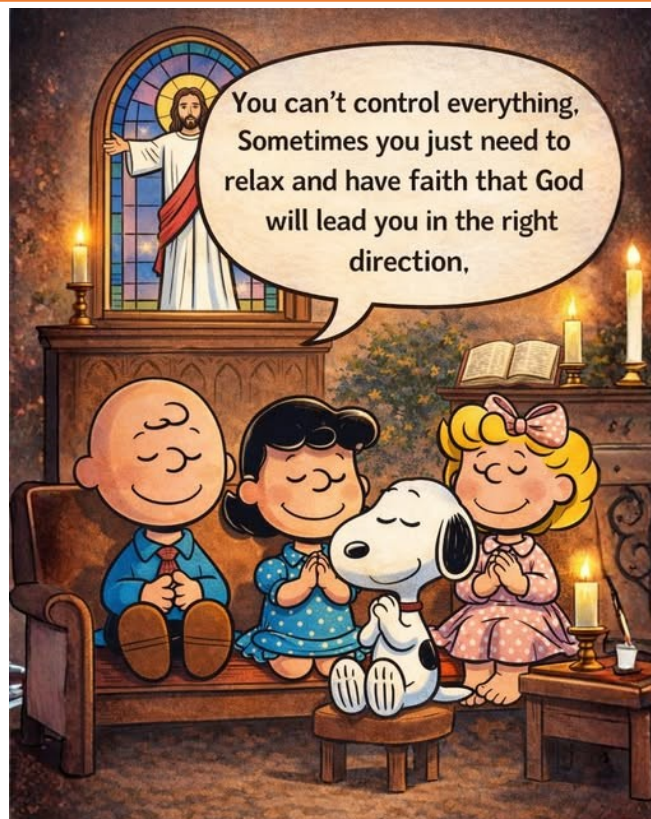
## Grayson Winkels Presents Pastor Mark with a Cool Drawing During Lenten Service

Jenny moved to approve the agenda. Seconded by Marlene. Motion passed.

Steve moved to approve the Secretary's Report. Seconded by Sue. Motion passed.

In the Treasurer's Report prepared by Kristi Anderson, February expenses remained routine, with the exception of the winter gas expense. March gas expense is less than February, hopefully this will continue to decrease with the coming of warmer weather. February expenses were more than income. Cherrie moved to accept the Treasurer's Report as presented. Seconded by Jenny. Motion passed. 15% of the budget had been spent at the end of February

From the Finance Committee, Dan reported the average weekly offering for February was below the needed amount to meet budgeted expenses. Average February attendance was 18. Apportionment received to-date was \$860.

From the Trustees Committee, the upstairs men's toilet has been fixed. The lever would stick when it was used and keep running water. Deb is interested in cleaning the church. The job duties from the previous hourly church custodian were presented and discussed. Cherrie moved to empower the SPRC, Trustees, and Kristi Anderson as Treasurer to come with a proposal for wages, tax planning, etc and bring back a solution to the April meeting. Seconded by Marlene. Motion passed.

From the Worship Committee, Pastor Mark reported feedback from the Lenten Services has been positive. The Wednesday Soup Suppers have had attendance of 35-40 people, and all 4 churches have been represented at the Lenten Services.

Paul and Suz Eberle and Brad Boice have been experimenting with the old speakers and newer speakers to figure out a balance that works. Sue mentioned there are Memorial Funds to purchase new speakers if they find ones that will work.

From the Missions Committee, Pastor Mark moved to donate \$500 from the Good Samaritan Fund to the Preston Food Shelf for MN Food Share Month. Seconded by Dan. Motion passed.

No further report from Staff/Parish Relations Committee.

From the Evangelism & Outreach Committee, Marlene extended appreciation to John & Shirley Goutcher for providing the sandwiches, grapes, cookies, and water for lunch prior to the David movie event in February, which was well-attended.

From the Education Committee, Pastor Mark reported LIFT will be starting again in April and the committee will be meeting soon for planning.

In Business, Cherrie presented the upcoming insurance renewal proposal with a couple options to raise the deductible and lower the monthly cost. However, the amount the monthly expense would decrease were very minimal when compared to how much the deductible would increase. Jenny moved to renew the insurance policy as it is and maintain the current deductible. Seconded by Dan. Motion passed.

Jenny reported Codfish planning is progressing nicely. The fish is ordered, along with other food stuffs and supplies. Tickets will be \$20.

During the Pastor's Report, Pastor Mark did not have anything additional to add.

Jenny moved to adjourn the meeting. Seconded by Marlene. Meeting adjourned at 8:30pm.

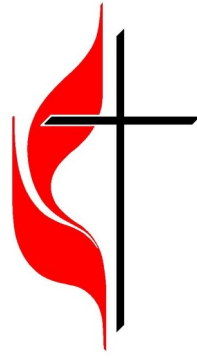
